Who made your clothes?

Many workers in the **textile factories in Myanmar** only get to go home to sleep – during their **period** they have to meet excessive **production goals, can't leave their workplace** and use inadequate sanitary facilities all while suffering from cramps and **pain**. Since the military reinstalled a **dictatorship**, the **prices** for period products rose drastically so that many can't afford them anymore. Due to the **earthquake** in March 2025, which killed many people and severely damaged the infrastructure, we decided to update our **fundraiser**!

Additionally, to the **period products** we're now also planning to distribute **everyday commodities** to the factory workers. Local **members of the union federation FGWM** will handle the distribution. They're organizing under harsh **repression** to improve the situation for everyone in Myanmar.

This action is part of a larger campaign for **better sanitary facilities, free period products** in the factories and the right to **get paid leave during menstruation**. For this we are in direct contact with **factory owners** and **brands**. And fortunately, our efforts have already shown first results.

Period products for all who need them!

Myanmar is not an exception – people are expected to do the same work during menstruation as anyone else, all over the world. Some are feeling worse than others though, as the pain varies from person to person. But countries like South Korea, Taiwan and Zambia have already implemented some form of **menstrual leave**. So there are no excuses! We call for the people that profit from the current conditions worldwide to **implement the local workers' demands!**
